

REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS

FOR ON-CALL PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AT UC DAVIS IN THE AREAS OF ARCHAEOLOGICAL RESOURCES, BIOLOGICAL RESOURCES, AND ENVIRONMENTAL PLANNING & DOCUMENTATION

The University of California, Davis (UC Davis), requests the submission of written statements of qualifications and required information at or before noon on November 2, 2007 for on-call professional services in the following areas:

- **Archaeological Resources:** Services include performing and reporting on archaeological resource surveys; providing CEQA support for archaeological resource analyses; developing and implementing feasible and effective mitigation measures for archaeological resources; and coordinating with interest groups.
- **Biological Resources:** Services include performing and reporting on biological resource surveys; providing CEQA support for biological resource analyses; identifying and evaluating impacts associated with the biological resources that occur, or have the potential to occur, on campus; developing and implementing feasible and effective mitigation measures for biological resources; and coordinating with resource agencies, including preparation of habitat conservation plans and obtaining necessary permits.
- **Environmental Planning and Documentation:** Services include performing environmental analyses for campus development projects, preparing tiered environmental documents, providing editorial and strategic environmental planning support, and participating in public outreach and involvement.

One contract will be awarded for each of the above listed service areas, and it is anticipated that each contract will extend from fall 2007 through summer 2010.
